


FALL 2013 ENROLLMENT OVERVIEW – UNIVERSITY SUMMARY All Campuses

Fall 2013 Undergraduate Student Enrollment by Kansas County College of Adult and Professional Studies



Fall 2013 Graduate Student Enrollment by Kansas County



Fall 2013 Undergraduate Student Enrollment by State College of Business, Arts, Sciences and Education










