


FALL 2014 ENROLLMENT OVERVIEW – UNIVERSITY SUMMARY – HEADCOUNT All Campuses

Fall 2014 Undergraduate Student Enrollment by State College of Business, Arts, Sciences and Education









#### 2013 TOTAL INSTITUTIONAL REVENUE AND EXPENSES


**2013 Total Institutional Revenue** \$39,292,000 (net of \$8,553,000 in tuition discounts)



#### 2013 Total Institutional Expense



#### 2014 TOTAL INSTITUTIONAL REVENUE AND EXPENSES


