In addition to their love for jazz singing, they share a common history as members of Friends University Jazz Vocal Ensemble over the past decade. Performing a mix of classic jazz standards and jazz-based arrangements of modern popular music, The Dreamliners strive to unite and delight their listeners across generations. Their most recent performances include opening for Count Basie Orchestra vocalist, Carmen Bradford, and a Youth Horizons Christmas benefit concert. Craig Curry, former Friends University faculty, serves as Musical Director and arranger for the group.

Zach Rich is a multi award-winning composer, trombonist, and educator from Wichita, KS. Zach has written music for many professional ensembles and organizations including the New York Youth Symphony, the Ravinia Steans Music Institute, the Texas Music Educators Association, the Oklahoma Music Educators Association, Pathways to Jazz, and many universities and high schools throughout the country. His works have also received awards by organizations such as ISJAC, the Jazz Education Network, ASCAP, ASMAC, Downbeat Magazine, Pathways to Jazz, and Jazz at Lincoln Center. Currently based in Colorado. Zach writes for and performs with a variety of ensembles throughout the Front Range and Midwest areas. His debut

album, Boundless, is available on all streaming platforms. "Boundless is full of stellar writing and playing - very enjoyable to the ear." -Chris Potter

Sam Hake

Sam Hake graduated from Friends in 2008 with a Bachelors of Music Business and was named the Jazz program's "Outstanding Jazz Student" in 2008. He was a founding member of the Friends Jazz combo Soulstice, and performed in all of the Jazz ensembles offered, on both drumset and vibraphone. Professionally he has performed in countless jazz combos with Wichita's finest jazz musicians and has been active in live theater and all music types. He has played with and been a part of: The Cherokee Maidens, Riverside 65, The Project H, The Wonder Revolution, Lisa Hittle Quartet, LoWhitHake Trio, David Lord Trio, and many more. Currently Sam is in his 14th year at Wichita Collegiate School as the Assistant band director where he happily teaches 5-12 instrumental music, drumline, and jazz ensembles. Recently Sam earned his Masters in Music with emphasis in education from Kansas State University in the summer of 2019.

Jason Whitmore

While attending Friends University, Jason Whitmore was one of the original members in the jazz quintet 'Soulstice' that won the University of North Texas Jazz Festival in 2009. Aside from performing in the UNT and UNC Greeley festivals, he has performed at the Orléans and Jazz à Juan festivals in France and the Umbria Jazz Festival in Italy. After attending Friends University, he has served as Artist in Residence at Southwestern College and taught at Cowley College for 4 years. Jason has performed with such prominent names and bands including, but not limited to, The Temptations, The Four Tops, Shirley Jones, Wayne Newton, Mark Preston, Johnny Mathis and most recently Carmen Bradford. In 2015, he completed a National Tour with Tony Award Winning Musical, 'Memphis' and in 2016 began a 4+ year stint with the Tony Award Winning Musical, 'After Midnight' aboard Norwegian Cruise Line's Escape where he was fortunate enough to work with such renowned artists as Brenda Braxton, Sharon Wilkins, Marva Hicks and Melinda Doolittle. With Friends University having such an influential effect on his life, Jason is incredibly grateful and humbled to be representing other alumni at the 29th Annual Jazz Festival.

Nathan Borton

Hailing from Kansas City, Nathan Borton is a Detroit based Jazz guitar player that draws heavily from the mid-western tradition of bebop and the blues. Currently, Nathan is a Teaching Assistant for the nationally acclaimed Jazz Studies program at Michigan State University under the direction of Rodney Whitaker. There he is studying guitar under the tutelage of the great Randy Napoleon. Nathan has played with and alongside names such as: Freddie Cole, Melissa Aldana, and Dmitri Matheny. Recently, Nathan was a finalist in the Wilson Center International Competition located in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Nathan is also an avid educator of music. He currently teaches at the Jazz and Creative Institute in Kalamazoo, Michigan under the direction of Benje and Ashley Daneman.

Miguel Francisco Santana Morales

Based in Wichita, KS

A versatile multi-instrumentalist Miguel Santana Morales is a local musician, educator, composer whose mission is to fuse more

than one culture through music to bring a new sound to all those who hear it. Born and raised in Carolina, Puerto Rico has spent almost 20 years studying and learning a large variety of music genres. After attending Berklee summer programs for 6 years Miguel Santana Morales took his understanding of music to another level which led him to learn other instruments, to arrange, compose, produce, and teach. He moved to Wichita in 2015, then Lisa Hittle reached out for Miguel to attend Friends University. He then continued his university studies and graduated in summer of 2020. He is currently Co-director of Conjunto Latino de Friends University. Miguel is a working musician in the city of Wichita and has been a part of many events, bands, concerts, and festivals. He has also toured with OKAN, a Cuban group based out of Canada and with Evann McIntosh in many cities nation-wide.

FRIENDS UNIVERSITY JAZZ PROGRAM

The Friends University jazz department consists of Concert Jazz Band, Conjunto Latino, Jazz Vocal Ensemble, three combos, beginning level improvisation classes for both instrumental and vocal students, and intermediate and advanced level improvisation via private instruction. There is a concentration in jazz degree for music performance majors.

Sebits, Crum, and McAfee Jazz Scholarships provide financial aid to outstanding jazz students and can be stacked on top of regular fine arts and academic scholarship funds.

The Sebits jazz guest artist endowment helps bring outstanding individuals and groups to campus for teaching and performing. Guest artists have included Marilyn Maye, Bobby Watson, Wycliffe Gordon, Wayne Bergeron, Maynard Ferguson, Clark Terry, The Count Basie Orchestra, New York Voices, The Big Phat Band, Carmen Bradford, Matt Wilson, and many, many others.

February 2022 marks the 29th annual Friends University Jazz Festival. This two-day festival attracts more than 800 middle school, high school, and junior college students. Featured clinicians at past festivals include Clark Terry, the Frank Mantooth Quartet with Kevin Mahogany, Shelly Berg with Carmen Bradford, University of North Texas Faculty Quintet, the Boulevard Big Band of Kansas City, the Cyrus Chestnut Trio, Gordon Goodwin's Big Phat Band, the Matt Wilson Quartet and the Count Basie Orchestra with the New York Voices, and many others.

The Friends University jazz groups perform extensively on campus, at area high schools, in runouts and tours, and at Wichita community events. Many Friends University students play professionally in the Wichita area and a number have continued their jazz studies at schools such as the University of North Texas, The University of Central Oklahoma, University of Northern Colorado, UMKC, Michigan State University, University of Nebraska, and many others.

The Friends University jazz groups have traveled extensively in the mid-west, and have won jazz festival competitions at The University of North Texas and the University of Kansas. They have been selected by taped audition to perform on the Kansas Music Educators Conference twelve years in row. Jazz Ensemble I traveled to Cuba to perform as a part of the 28th Annual Havana International Jazz Festival, Dec. 20-24, 2012. They were the only college jazz ensemble from the US invited to perform that year.
