Martín Balmaceda is an experienced theatre educator and director known for his passion for creative collaboration. He has worked with artists from various fields to create unique experiences for his audiences. He has directed original productions and adaptations of classic plays throughout North and South America. Martín's recent productions include *An Enemy of the People, Medea,* and *Acheron: The River of*

Tragedy. He has worked at renowned theater venues in New York and taught at various esteemed institutions. Martín is a graduate of the Lincoln Center Directors' Lab and holds an MFA from Sarah Lawrence College. He was the artistic director of Compañía de Teatro at Universidad de las Américas Puebla. Martín is excited to direct this student production of He Said Yes/He Said No and to collaborate with the creative community at Friends University.

Words of the Director

I am thrilled to be directing Bertolt Brecht's He Said Yes/He Said No at the Friends University theatre program. Inspired by the open landscape of Kansas and the values of Friends University, my focus has been on presenting a play that highlights the importance of community, one's individual decisions, the consequences of those decisions, and most importantly, the openness to consequences for the individual and community. He Said Yes/He Said No is a simple parable that delves into an exploration of accepting circumstances and rules without questioning. The protagonist, a child, gets two chances to seek an understanding of right and wrong, and of justice, leading the child to a profound transformation within the community. I hope that the audience will enjoy this theatrical experience in which the characters' journeys and transformations are told through singing, movement, and live music.

BERTOLT BRECHT

Bertolt Brecht, born in Augsburg, Germany (1898-1956), was a visionary of the theatre world. He was a multi-talented artist, excelling as a dramatist, poet, theatre director, and practitioner. He revolutionized the way we think about drama by pioneering a new theatrical style famously known as 'epic theatre.' Brecht's unique approach to theatre emphasized social and political commentary, and it continues to inspire artists and audiences alike today.
