

2023 Friends University Alumni Survey Analysis

Participants 1 -

Responses to the survey were received from 312 Friends alumni. Nine responses to the survey included only answers to the demographic questions, so their responses were removed prior to analysis for an official count of 303. By comparison, there were 542 responses to the alumni survey that was distributed in 2018.

Characteristics of Respondents

- 75% of responses were from CBASE graduates.
- Overall, 61% of responses were from women. Women represent an even higher percentage of respondents among CAPS and GRAD.
- Over half of alumni indicated that they are graduates of Business or Education programs. The fewest number of responses were received from graduates of the Marriage and Family Therapy program.
- 38% of those who responded indicated that they participated in the fine arts, while 25% indicated that they participated in athletics.
- 21% of those who responded are alumni from recent years (2015-present). In general, there was a reasonably even distribution across generations.

Preparation for Employment

Of the 294 alumni who responded to the question, 26% said that Friends University prepared them "extremely well" for employment. Only 5% said that Friends did not prepare them at least moderately well for employment. Groups of students that were especially positive about their preparation for employment include graduates of the Education programs (CBASE and GRAD), CBASE STEM graduates, and graduates of the CAPS and GRAD Business programs.

Preparation for Graduate Study

Of the 153 alumni who responded to the question, 26% said that Friends University prepared them "extremely well" for graduate study. GRAD graduates were more likely to answer "extremely well" than CBASE graduates (36% vs. 24%). Over 50% of 26 CBASE STEM graduates said that Friends prepared them "extremely well" for graduate study. Only 3% of all graduates said that Friends did not prepare them at least moderately well for graduate study.

Satisfaction with Education

Of the 283 alumni who responded to the question, 66% said that they were "extremely satisfied" with their education from Friends University. Only 4% of graduates were dissatisfied, including just one "extremely dissatisfied" graduate. The two divisions that had a higher percentage of graduates who were only "somewhat satisfied" (rather than "extremely satisfied") were CBASE Fine Arts and GRAD Business. By generation, graduates from 1974-1993 are the most "extremely satisfied" with their education, while the most recent graduates (2015-present) are the least "extremely satisfied" with their education. In general, satisfaction increases as time since graduation also increases.

Meeting of Mission

Of the 283 alumni who responded to the question, 28% said that Friends University is currently meeting its mission. 60% of responses were positive ("well"), 7% of responses were negative ("poorly"), and 32% said that they did not have enough information to answer the question. A total of 16 of the 21 "poorly" responses came from CBASE graduates, and 7 of those 16 CBASE responses came from Fine Arts graduates. Graduates of the Business program at all levels were the most likely to respond positively to this question. Graduates from 1974-1980 and from 2015-present were the most likely to respond that Friends is meeting its mission "well," but those graduating 2015-present also account for nearly half of the "poorly" responses.

<u>Salary</u>

Of the 200 alumni who responded to the question with something other than "prefer not to answer," 34% said that their salary is less than \$50,000, 21% said that their salary is more than \$100,000, and 46% said that their salary is between \$50,000 and \$99,999. Populations of graduates that were more likely to report that their salary was less than \$50,000 include CBASE graduates of Fine Arts or Theology and Humanities (54% and 47%, respectively, not including those who prefer not to answer). 40% of CBASE STEM graduates reported salaries in the highest category. Graduates from 1994-2000 were the most likely to report salaries over \$100,000, while over half of recent graduates (2015-present) reported salaries of less than \$50,000.
