Dr. James Knight

A native of Wichita, Kansas, Dr. James Knight won the Naftzger Piano Award and the Kansas Cultural Trust Award enabling him to study in New York City with Constance Keene. He was a finalist in the Leschetizky Piano Competition and also performed at Steinway Hall in New York City.

Dr. Knight is now in his twenty-ninth year of teaching at Friends University, where he is an Assistant Professor of Piano. He has had several prizewinning students in local competitions including the WMMTA piano concerto auditions, the Senseney-Schneider competition, the Miller Concerto Auditions, and the Steinway Young Artist Auditions. Dr. Knight's compositions are published by SNP Press.

Adin Gilmore is an award-winning composer and performer based in Kansas. He graduated from Friends University in 2024 with a degree in tuba performance and is currently studying for a masters in tuba performance at Wichita State University.
