DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Sarah Ruhl's *Eurydice* is written in three movements – a poetic symphony of love, loss, memory & rhythm. Although the play is an elegy, it lives in the world of magical realism - a form of theatre that takes reality and elevates it, making the impossible, possible! Emotion is heightened, fleeting, childlike and profound. In our production we honor the fantastical circumstances, but also find the string-like connections. We explore the play as a meditation; (dis)harmonious, (off)balanced, challenged to accept imperfection and transience.

In the original Greek myth Eurydice marries Orpheus. Shortly after her wedding, she is pursued by a covetous shepherd, steps on a serpent and suffers an untimely death. Orpheus then travels to the underworld to rescue her, and using the power of his music, softens Hades' heart. Hades is so moved by Orpheus' music that he grants him passage to restore Eurydice to the upperworld. Yet, in true mythological form, there is a catch. If Orpheus looks behind him to see Eurydice before she has passed through the gates, he will lose her forever. He looks...and sends his lover back into the underworld for eternity.

When I first read *Eurydice*, I was immediately captivated by the effortless beauty of its poetic language. Sarah Ruhl masterfully re-imagines the age-old myth of Orpheus and Eurydice, offering a profound and entirely new perspective as we navigate the world through Eurydice's eyes. Through this fresh perspective, we discover the timeless themes of love, the journey of grief, the art of letting go, and the weight of memories. How do you remember to forget? On earth we are left to cope with the tragedy of death, finding solace in the poetic space between the words and notes of music.


